# Army Substance Abuse Program

## ASAP A Soldier Readiness Program

- Mission: The mission of the Army Substance Abuse Program (ASAP) is to strengthen the overall fitness and effectiveness of the Army's total workforce, to conserve manpower and to enhance the combat readiness of Soldiers.
- This Command Program emphasizes Soldier Readiness and Personal Responsibility.
- The Command, at all levels, play a vital role in prevention, biochemical testing, early identification of possible substance abusers, rehabilitation, and when necessary, swift administrative or judicial actions.



# Army Substance Abuse Program

## ASAP Services:

- Provide Substance Abuse Prevention Education and data collection for organizations
- Provide Information – high risk behavior data, campaigns, posters, pamphlets, etc.
- Train and Certify Unit/Battalion Prevention Leaders (UPLs/BPLs)
- Implement the Risk Reduction Program (RRP)
- Oversee the Drug/Alcohol Testing Program
- Clinically screen personnel for possible substance abuse issues and make recommendations to the Chain of Command
- Provide Treatment Services (Out-Patient/Recommend In-Patient to the CoC as appropriate)
