


Risk Management In Your Home

Risk Management is the decision-making process used to mitigate risks associated with any hazard.

Step 1 - Identify hazards.

Step 2 - Assess hazards to determine risk.

Step 3 - Develop controls and make risk decisions.

Step 4 - Implement controls.

Step 5 - Supervise and evaluate.

HEATER SAFETY

- ◆ Plug heaters directly into wall socket, never an extension cord
- ◆ Place heaters where they can not be tipped over
- ◆ Never leave space heaters unattended
- ◆ Do not use heaters to dry clothes or other items
- ◆ Keep space heaters at least 3 feet away from anything that could burn
- ◆ Does it have a tip switch?
- ◆ Ensure your heater has a label by a nationally recognized testing company, such as Underwriter's Laboratories (UL).



HAPPY HALLOWEEN

- **Kids vs. Cars:**
 - Be reflective or have lights
 - Stay on sidewalks
 - Always have a supervision with children
 - No running
- **Costumes:**
 - Use fire retardant costumes
 - Keep candles, heaters, or other flames away from doors and walkways
 - Keep costume short to avoid trips



HOLIDAY LIGHTS

- **Don't use tacks, nails or metal staples to secure light strands**
 - **Use insulated staples**
 - **Pre-installed hooks are safe and convenient**
- **Install lights without power (unplug)**
 - **Avoids shock if you touch overlooked exposed wire**
- **Fasten outdoor lights securely to protect from wind damage**

LADDER SAFETY

- **Fall Protection**
 - Use fall protection if working over heights > 10 feet
- **Ladder Safety**
 - Inspect and use ladder appropriate for the job
 - Second person to hold ladder
